The Noble County Board of DD continues to coordinate, fund and deliver quality supports to eligible residents of our county. We are pleased to present this annual Community Report Card, an overview of a year altered by a relentless virus known as COVID-19.

For people with disabilities, 2020 saw connections broken, jobs lost and day programs shuttered or reduced in size. People had to stay home and that meant direct support professionals were on the job for days, even weeks, at a time providing residential support. Social distance meant we had to be even more intentional about maintaining relationships. We checked in with phone calls and porch visits. We assembled care packages of food and other necessities and delivered them to adults and families in need. We learned to hold meetings via Skype, Zoom and Facetime.

Despite the virus, we continued work that improved people's lives. We enhanced virtual services in early intervention to support families of babies and toddlers. We continued transition planning with teens. We provided technology for tele-visits with family, friends and healthcare professionals. We worked with our partners to locate and create safe opportunities for adults. We provided additional funding to ease the burden placed on our provider partners.

As we look back at 2020, we know that our ability to provide what people need is because of the strong support we have from the community. Thank you for placing your confidence and trust in us. We will continue to be compassion-driven, trauma-informed, and fiscally responsible. We will continue to do whatever it takes to enrich the lives of people with developmental disabilities.

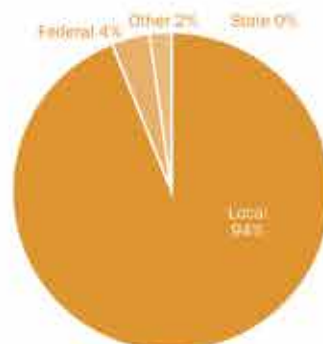

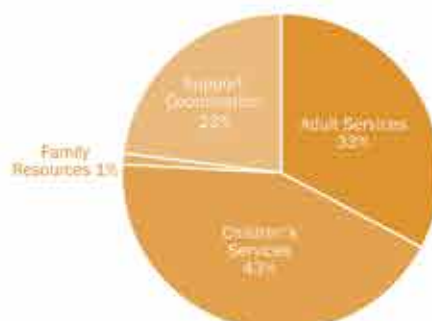
What We Do
